Quilt for Change has a new project!

"Sister Artists" was launched in March. The main goal of this project is to raise funds for victims of Gender Based Violence (GBV) in Mali in West Africa through an online auction of art quilts.

Quilt for Change is looking for quilt artists to collaborate with these women and turn their embroidered blocks into art quilts. The quilts will be exhibited in Washington, DC in the fall of this year (venue to be determined), and then

auctioned online to raise funds for Sini Brodage in Mali. Photos of the quilts will also be posted on the *Quilt for Change* and *The Advocacy Project's* websites.

Outside the Ordinary, Essex Art Center (Essex Art Center), 56 Island Street, Lawrence, MA. March 20 - May 31, 2019. "Outside the Ordinary" describes the work of the Joined by Stitch fiber artists. The eight SAQA/MARI artists begin with everyday materials--fabric and thread--and create works well beyond the ordinary through innovative piecing, fusing, felting and stitching, as well as printing and dyeing. The common thread binding the separate works together is the outside, the world that surrounds all of us.

A Quilted Look at Lincoln, A Quilt Show at Bemis Hall by The Lincoln Quilters, 15 Bedford Rd, Lincoln, MA (https://www.lincolntown.org/Facilities/Facility/Details/Bemis-Hall-3). March 2 through April 30, 2019. The Lincoln Quilters are a group of nine Lincoln women including Anne Crosby, Nancy Constable, Tricia Deck, Linda MacNeil, Margaret Olson, Lucy Sachs, Kate Sacknoff, Jane Solar, and Dilla Tingley. Drawn together by a shared interest in quilting and fiber arts, the group began meeting monthly five years ago to inspire each other, share their creations, get suggestions from each other on personal projects and develop new pieces as a group. Quilts in this show were created by Lincoln scenes that each artist chose to represent. Proceeds from the sale of these quilts will be donated to the Lincoln Food Bank.

Liberty and Justice: The Sweet to Satirical Art of Salley Mavor, Cotuit Center for the Arts (https://artsonthecape.org/), 4404 Falmouth Rd, Cotuit, MA. March 2 – April 20, 2019, Artist Talk – "Sweet to Satirical", Saturday, April 13, 2019 at 11:00 am. The exhibit is an opportunity to see a wide array of works by fiber artist and illustrator, Salley Mavor, who has recently added political satire to her list of subjects to explore. She uses small dolls as a metaphor for playing house in a safe controlled environment that has been taken over by outside political forces. The exhibit features a collection of photographs of scenes she created in a doll house and a stop-motion animated film, which satirize the current administration in Washington. The original dolls and props used in the film will also be on display. Although Salley Mavor's foray into political art is the centerpiece of the show, the exhibition also includes original embroidered children's book illustrations and other artwork from earlier in her 40-year career. The inclusion of these pieces tracks the evolution of her artistic journey from "innocence" to tackling real world issues.

SAQA's president Lisa Walton (https://lisawaltonartist.com/) is scheduled to teach a class at ProChemical and Dye (https://prochemicalanddye.net), 126 Shove St., Fall River, MA, titled "Permission to Play", from July 15-19, 2019. Lisa is joining us from Australia. "Permission to Play" is an opportunity to play with a wide range of surface design tools and techniques. This 3-day workshop will explore color, textures and embellishments. It is suitable for all levels.

Skills learned will include:

- Stamp designing and making with compressed sponge and other stamp making materials
- Fabric painting, sun printing, manipulation, patterning, mark making
- Thermofax screen printing
- Stenciling
- Textured rubbings using a wide variety of natural and supplied surfaces

- Painted fusibles
- Foiling
- Deconstructed Screen Printing
