



The Art Of Cute is an exhibition that takes a serious look at a powerful aesthetic that is often not taken seriously. The exhibit is organized into three sections: Normative Cute, Applied Cute and Meta Cute and will explore why we are drawn to that which is cute and how its impact is felt in life, in design and in art.

A selection of topical and political art by fiber artist Salley Mavor will be displayed in the Meta Cute or "beyond" cute category. This part of the exhibit explores how cute, combined with other

aesthetics, can create meaningful art that can be ironic, disturbing, political, joyous, humorous and provocative.

I will be teaching a Westalee Template Quilting Made Easy event on J**une 7th and 8th** for Murray's Sewing Fabrics on the Cape in Orleans, MA. Pre-registration is required. There may still be space available if you are interested. Sign up through the store (508) 255-0653. If you tend to send your quilts out to be quilted, ruler template quilting is a great way for you to quilt your piece using your own quilting voice without relying on a longarmer. This method is easy to learn and very accurate while allowing you freedom to create your own original designs.

#### Machine Quilting Retreat with Allison Wilbur

Take your machine quilting to the next level! This three day retreat will give you the skills, techniques and design ideas to confidently quilt complex motifs on your home



sewing machine. Learn to respond to tension problems under the guidance of an experienced teacher. Topics include materials (thread, batting, needles), machine set up, walking foot designs, meandering variations, feathers, machine trapunto, continuous curves, micro fill and design elements. Slide shows, videos and on-machine exercises help teach concepts in a variety of ways to solidify your understanding.

Allison's approach to quilting is based on the belief that quilting is half the creative processor making a quilt. As a machine quilting teacher, longarm quilter, pattern designer, and art quilter, Allison helps quilters build a quilting

"vocabulary" of designs and motifs that fit into a variety of quilts. #### SAQA President Lisa Walton to Teach at ProChem July 15-19, 2019

SAQA's president Lisa Walton (https://lisawaltonartist.com/) is scheduled to teach a class at ProChemical and Dye (https://prochemicalanddye.net), 126 Shove St., Fall River, MA, titled "**Permission to Play**", from July 15-19, 2019. Lisa is joining us from Australia. "Permission to Play" is an opportunity to play with a wide range of surface design tools and techniques. This 3-day workshop will explore color, textures and embellishments. It is suitable for all levels.

Skills learned will include:

- · Stamp designing and making with compressed sponge and other stamp making materials
- Fabric painting, sun printing, manipulation, patterning, mark making
- Thermofax screen printing
- Stenciling
- Textured rubbings using a wide variety of natural and supplied surfaces
- Painted fusibles
- Foiling
- Deconstructed Screen Printing

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
