





THE ART OF CUTE

The Art Of Cute is an exhibition that takes a serious look at a powerful aesthetic that is often not taken seriously. The exhibit is organized into three sections: Normative Cute, Applied Cute and Meta Cute and will explore why we are drawn to that which is cute and how its impact is felt in life, in design and in art.

A selection of topical and political art by fiber artist Salley Mavor will be displayed in the Meta Cute or "beyond" cute category. This part of the exhibit explores how cute, combined with other aesthetics, can create

meaningful art that can be ironic, disturbing, political, joyous, humorous and provocative.

TRADITIONAL SLOW STITCH:
INDIGO SHIBORI AND BORO |
CAROL ANNE GROTRIAN JULY 29 - AUGUST 2, 2019

Traditional Slow Stitch: Indigo Shibori and Boro

If you love the idea of slow stitching, come experience two age-old Japanese traditions of hand sewing in this five-day workshop. Create new indigo-dyed cloth with shibori, where stitches are sewn, gathered and dyed. Designs are revealed as the sewing is removed. Thanks to centuries of experimentation, there are seemingly endless variations to try.

Then turn to boro, a tradition of patching and mending, born of a need to revive worn, once precious,

fabrics. Created by layering a variety of existing fabrics, our boro textiles will include the shibori dyed in class. Usually densely hand-stitched, boro has been called "country sashiko."

Though shibori and boro both rely on, but are not limited to, simple running stitches, the results are elegant and complex. It's optional to guilt the layers with batting. Students at all levels are welcome.

Machine Quilting Retreat with Allison Wilbur

August 16 - 18 | Allison Wilbur Quilts and Meraki Stitch Studio

30 Cutler Street, Studio 101A & B, Warren RI

Take your machine quilting to the next level! This three day retreat will give you the skills, techniques and design ideas to confidently quilt complex motifs on your home sewing machine. Learn to respond to tension problems under the guidance of an experienced teacher. Topics include materials

(thread, batting, needles), machine set up, walking foot designs, meandering variations, feathers, machine trapunto, continuous curves, micro fill and design elements. Slide shows, videos and on-machine exercises help teach concepts in a variety of ways to solidify your understanding.

Allison's approach to quilting is based on the belief that quilting is half the creative processor making a quilt. As a machine quilting teacher, longarm quilter, pattern designer, and art quilter, Allison helps quilters build a quilting "vocabulary" of designs and motifs that fit into a variety of quilts.

SAQA's president Lisa Walton (https://lisawaltonartist.com/) is scheduled to teach a class at ProChemical and Dye (https://prochemicalanddye.net), 126 Shove St., Fall River, MA, titled "Permission to Play", from July 15-19, 2019. Lisa is joining us from Australia. "Permission to Play" is an opportunity to play with a wide range of surface design tools and techniques. This 3-day workshop will explore color, textures and embellishments. It is suitable for all levels.

Skills learned will include:

- Stamp designing and making with compressed sponge and other stamp making materials
- Fabric painting, sun printing, manipulation, patterning, mark making
- Thermofax screen printing
- Stenciling
- Textured rubbings using a wide variety of natural and supplied surfaces
- Painted fusibles
- Foiling
- Deconstructed Screen Printing

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
